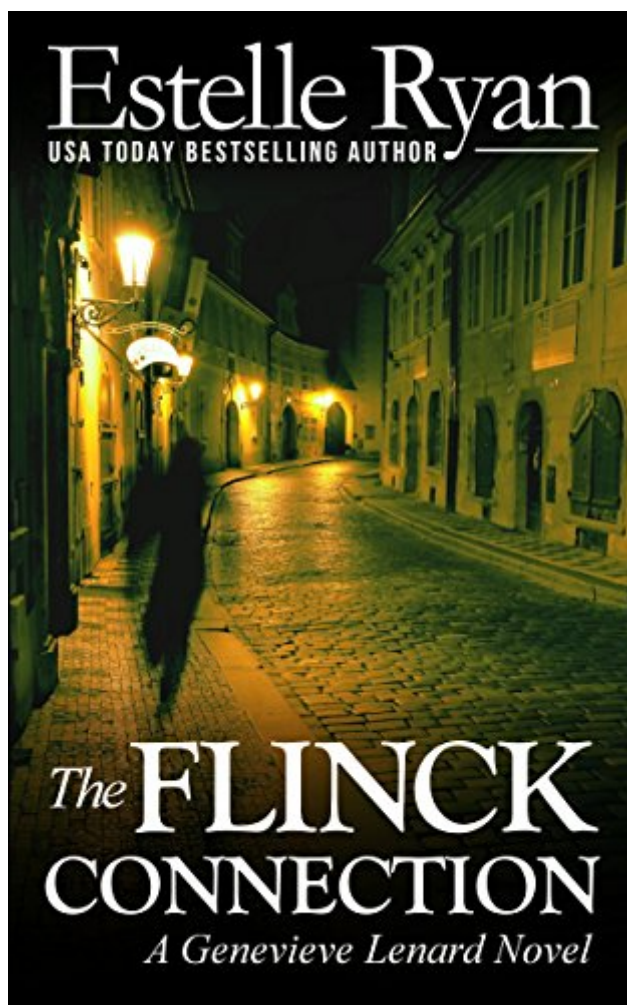

Free sample books work like a charm when the writing, character development and plot are as good as Ryan's Connection series! I got the first one free, then had to buy the next two and WAIT to buy this fourth one. The twists and turns just get better, as do the connections among the characters. I

love the art and Mozart woven through them and hope the high functioning nonneurotypical heroine is plausible. The wait for the next book will seem long. I will undoubtedly reread the whole series at least one more time.

Dr. Genevieve Lenard is still doing what she does best... Reading nonverbal body language. In this story, Colin calls her to have Manny go to an address that he is at. He has found a dead body. He gives no explanation for why he is there in the first place. He simply tells Jenny to ask Nikki. Nikki has been receiving DM's (Direct Messages) to her Twitter account. They are clues, but they are also vague and confusing. The man who was killed, supposedly had a Flinck painting masterpiece in his home. No trace of it could be found by Collin. As the clues come in, more stolen paintings turn up. Now Genevieve's team is being taken off the case and told to make a museum robbery that just occurred their only priority. I thought this book started a little slow, I have enjoyed the last three stories. This one did pick up steam and drew you right into it. Government conspiracies, art thefts, money laundering, and the return of Dukwick, the International Assassin villain from the 3rd book in the series. This is book four. It continues with Genevieve's developing skills of friendship with Collin, Vinnie, Francine and Manny. These stories can be read separately, but to keep abreast of Genevieve's developing people skills, it's best to read them in sequence. Genevieve has found a soft spot in my heart. I like her.

I have enjoyed each book in this series and think they are all deserving of five stars. This book deserves six!!! This last one not only had a great mystery but also allowed the characters on the team to evolve to include mutual respect. Well done.

Genevieve and company are back and knee-deep in art theft, murder and political corruption. Ryan doesn't disappoint in the fourth book of her fabulous series.
